SUMMER SCHOOL BASE RATE IS \$154.78 PER COMPLETED CREDIT

- High School courses taken by junior high students will be funded if they are taken in the summer semester prior to entering Grade 10 to a maximum of 10 credits per student.
- Summer school funding is provided for up to 10 credits completed per student in the summer for high school courses.
- RAP, Work Experience and special projects courses are required to provide 25 hours per credit, in accordance with the Guide to Education.
- Summer school funding will be calculated based on the previous school year completed credits.

PROVINCIAALLY AUTHORIZED SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL COURSES AND COURSE CODES

- Dual Credit courses are a great way to explore career pathways and learn skills to increase success levels in Work Integrated Learning.
- Work Integrated Learning courses have three main purposes:
 - Support students in career pathway exploration and skills development
 - Award credits to students for graduation, grade point average and scholarships
 - Support employers through WCB and incentive funding
